

About the Office of Higher Education

The Minnesota Office of Higher Education is a cabinet-level state agency providing students with financial aid programs and information to help them gain access to postsecondary education. The agency also serves as the state's clearinghouse for data, research and analysis on postsecondary enrollment, financial aid, finance and trends.

The Minnesota State Grant Program is the largest financial aid program administered by the Office of Higher Education, awarding more than \$224 million annually in need-based grants to Minnesota residents attending eligible colleges, universities and career schools in Minnesota. The agency oversees other state scholarship programs, tuition reciprocity programs, a student loan program, Minnesota's 529 College Savings Plan, licensing and early college awareness programs for youth.

Status of North Star Promise Scholarship Fund

North Star Promise Scholarship program legislation was originally passed during the 2023 MN legislative session and can be found in statute 136A.1465. For the 2024-25 award year the North Star Promise program consists of two separate awards: North Star Promise Base (NSP Base) and North Star Promise Plus (NSP+). The NSP Base award is the "last-dollar" tuition and fee award. The NSP+ award is given to an NSP eligible student in the amount of 15% of the Pell Grant amount that student received. NSP+ awards were available for fall 2024 and spring 2025 terms, but not the summer 2025 term.

North Star Promise (NSP) Scholarship program began awarding funds to students in the fall term of 2024 and has continued through spring 2025 and summer 2025. The following report details program spending information as of August 25, 2025. Closeout of the 2024-25 award year will happen after August 29, 2025. The information in this report is preliminary until the program has closed out for the award year. Final data will be presented in the legislatively mandated report due February 15, 2026.

As of August 25, 2025, North Star Promise has paid \$108,237,015 in awards to 53,567 unique students for the 2024-25 academic year. The tables below indicate the status of the scholarship fund as it pertains to overall spending between both the NSP Base and NSP+ awards, the number of students receiving NSP by term, and the average award amounts by term.
