**You must notify your school’s financial aid office within 10 days if any of the following changes occur:**

- A change in your child care provider
- A change in provider rates
- A change in the number of child care hours needed
- You begin receiving Minnesota Family Investment Program (MFIP) benefits
- You begin receiving other child care assistance
- A parent or legal guardian becomes available to provide child care
- Any change in your enrollment or personal circumstances that may affect your eligibility, as outlined in the student certification section of your application

If you withdraw or reduce enrollment after receiving a Postsecondary Child Care Grant, **all or a part of the grant may need to be repaid to your college.**

A copy of this award notice, along with the provider section of your application, may be shared with your child care provider. Schools may choose to disburse **funds either to you or directly to the provider.** Grant funds cannot be disbursed before the start of each term.

**Child Care Grant funds must be used to pay your child care provider. Failure to pay your provider may result in cancellation of your award and repayment of funds to your school.**
